The Department of German Language and Culture at Sungshin Women's University boasts a relatively long history within the German language and literature academic community in Korea. At one point during its heyday, it earned the honour of being designated as a "specialized department" representing Sungshin Women's University. Unlike German Literature departments at most universities in Korea that opened in the 1980s that experienced many difficulties, including the implementation of the undergraduate system in the 1990s, our university's department has consistently thrived as a department since its inception, garnering considerable external attention.

Based on these optimal conditions, the future of our dedicated German literature students can be even brighter. The ideological competition era between the East and the West has transformed into a multinational (economic) cooperation era, leading to greater diversification in international relations than ever before. In various professional fields, proficiency in English alone is no longer sufficient for maintaining a competitive edge. Furthermore, with the ongoing implementation of the Free Trade Agreement (FTA) with the European Union (EU), Korean society may experience a shortage of personnel proficient in the German language. Germany is an economic hub in Europe, hosting almost all EU representative offices for Korea. German is not only used in Germany but also in Austria, Switzerland, and other German-speaking regions, making it the most widely spoken language in Europe.

The 'Second Renaissance' of the Department of German Language and Culture at Sungshin Women's University is opened with pride. Currently, the faculty members are actively contemplating the education system and operations from the perspective of students, building strong skills, and preparing confident and impressive students who are ready to become true protagonists of the internationalization era.
