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## Academics

The Department of Japanese Language and Culture at Sungshin Women's University was established in 1972 as the Department of Foreign Language Education (Japanese major) at Sungshin Women's Teachers College. In 1979, the department changed its name to the Department of Japanese Language and Literature, and in September 1993, it introduced an evening program. In the academic year 2006, with the goal of enhancing the university's competitiveness and improving the quality of the educational environment, the daytime program's capacity was increased, while the recruitment of new students for the evening program was suspended. In 2017, in response to social changes and to cultivate individuals with diverse and in-depth expertise, the department changed its name to the Department of Japanese Language and Culture.

The department provides its students with knowledge and practical skills as specialists in Japanese through various curricula related to Japanese language, literature, and culture. Additionally, the department sends exchange students to universities such as Tokyo Women's University, Gakushuin Women's University, and Kansai University. It also operates short-term study abroad programs to cultivate international perspectives and cultural literacy. Furthermore, the department organizes various academic and cultural events, including Japanese-language original plays, native-language newspaper production, and speech contests. Through these activities, it deepens academic research in the field of Japanese language and culture while enhancing understanding of international issues, particularly those centered on Japan and Korea. The department aims to produce talented females equipped with the correct values, professional skills, and international insights needed in the age of globalization and information.
