This academic department was established in 1972 as the Department of Korean History Education at Sungshin Women's Teacher's College. Subsequently, in 1977, it was designated as the Department of Korean History, and in 1982, it underwent a reorganization into the Department of History.

Since 1982, the department has published THE SUNGSHIN SAHAK : The Historical Journal of Sungshin women's University, and in 2000, The Journal of History was published. The academic scope of the Department of History is divided into Korean history, Asian history, and Western history, with fields including political history, socio-economic history, cultural history, archaeology, and more. In addition to regular departmental courses, the department organizes academic field trips and history conferences in both spring and fall. Anyone interested in the fact that the present and future are conceived from the past is welcome to choose the path of the Department of History.
